2. We were able to stand up our surgical suite allowing us to decrease the length of stay for our animals.

4. We have assembled a wonderful team of veterinarians to enable us to provide faster and more cost-effective care to our shelter animals.
5. We have provided transportation in collaboration with a local cat welfare group to facilitate even more spay and neuter procedures to the community.

Hard at Work

Your Pensacola Humane Society has been quite busy this year implementing our programs and saving lives! We have created 720 new families through our adoption program. As a result of our success with adoptions and managed intakes we maintained a Save Rate of 98 percent.

Our Pet Pantry has played a significant role in our success. Nearly 9,000 pounds of food given out translates to more than 32,000 meals for pets which helps keep them in their homes and with their families. Our volunteers have been critical in keeping our programs running smoothly with 75 active volunteers contributing more than 5,200 hours.

We actively assisted Everett Animal Welfare Group transport more than 700 cats for alterations. During this time, we diligently worked to get our surgical suite operational, and since May 2024 have completed 270 surgical procedures.

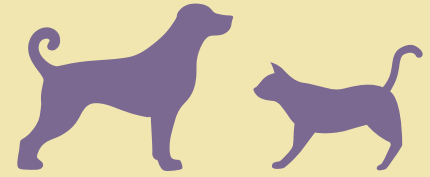

Once Tiana was five months old, she started training to be a therapy dog like her big sister. The plan was to replace Hope in a few years when she retired. Sadly, Hope unexpectedly passed away in March.

Tiana continued her classes, passing each until she earned her AKC Canine Good Citizen award. Tiana then became a certified therapy dog with Canines for Christ. She now visits clients at L&L Executive Adult Day Care, and on Tuesdays she visits the USO at NAS Pensacola.

Tiana is thriving in her new role and continues to bring joy to those around her.
